The purpose of the Country Club Hills Civic Association (CCHCA) is to encourage civic involvement, to promote the general welfare of the community, to represent the community to the Fairfax City Government, to further the appearance and safety of the neighborhood, and to develop community social activities. All households in Country Club Hills are eligible for membership; annual dues are \$15 per household for the year covering January 1 through December 31.

The association is managed by a board of directors, elected by the membership each year at the first of two annual meetings, in May. The second meeting is held in October. The board meets every two months. Board members may hold the same position for only two years. Members are encouraged to contact board members with ideas or concerns.

CCHCA represents the neighborhood's interests to the city on proposed land use, environmental issues, road improvements, school development, and any other city activity that may affect the quality of life of CCH residents. The president, the vice president for civic affairs, and the vice president for community safety have particular responsibilities in these areas; other board members may also take on roles as circumstances and their expertise dictate.

Social activities typically include Halloween, Christmas, and Spring activities for children; an Ice Cream Social to kick off the summer, Concert on the Commons and a big community picnic around Labor Day, Santa Claus visiting homes and Holiday Decoration Contest. The association publishes and distributes a newsletter every three months and this directory every other year. The newsletter and directory go to every house in Country Club Hills.

CCHCA is not a homeowners' association – membership is voluntary, and the association does not set or enforce rules governing the appearance of houses and yards. However, all members are encouraged to follow the city's zoning ordinances and to do their part to keep the neighborhood beautiful. Assistance is available through the Community Appearance Committee for residents who are unable to keep up with yard work or home maintenance.
