Hello Country Club Hills and Happy New Year! I can't believe 2018 is here already. I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas, got lots of rest, ate good food, and are now ready to face the rest of winter.

We now have guttering installed (by our neighbor James Sabo) at the pavilion down at the Commons with a downspout to the rain barrel. It will make watering all the plantings much easier. We also have two new birdhouses installed by the garden club.

Fairfax City has installed a pad near the pavilion for the new garden shed. The shed is for storing the tubs holding all of our events supplies as well as gardening equipment. It has been ordered and should be put together and placed soon.

I'm sure many of you noticed the speed zone set up by the Fairfax City Police in October at the Commons. I requested the survey due to several e-mails received from residents stating that we might have a speeding problem on Spring Lake Terrace near that area. The posted speed limit in that area is 25 mph. During the 3 day survey, 1,245 vehicles passed the camera. Only 3 vehicles were clocked over the speed limit: one

going 41 mph, one 37 and one 35. The police have determined that we don't have a speeding problem but they are committed to patrolling the area more often to look for any violators.

The board is looking for ideas for new events to have in the neighborhood; please pass any ideas you might have to any board member. Of course, we are still planning our usual annual events. We'd just like to offer more. And any improvements you might like to see in CCH. We are always happy to make our neighborhood more beautiful and safe.

Here's hoping winter is bearable without too much snow and ice. If you see any of your neighbors needing help, please reach out to a board member so that we can assist, if possible.








Kids' Coloring Spot

2017 Holiday Decorations!

The Country Hills Garden Club judges had an enjoyable time driving through the neighborhood admiring the holiday decorations. Even more houses were decorated this year, and the designs were more cohesive and coordinated. This year we were especially delighted by the bright and festive variety of colored lights in the displays, as well as the many displays with all-white lights. Another impressive new trend this year was the number of houses with rooflines that were entirely outlined in lights. Once again Country Club Hills has demonstrated its holiday spirit! Now, on to the winners:

The NEWBIE award goes to Catie and Andrew Bishop of 3410 Park Hill Place. The display is all in white lights. It includes an outlined roofline, a wreath of bright lights between the front windows, and shrubbery covered in light. An outstanding feature is a tree with a dramatic up-light that gives it a sculptural effect. The Bishops moved into the neighborhood in July, and we are delighted to welcome them to our community and thank them for joining in our holiday decorations festivities!

The best TRADITIONAL display goes to Sue and Colin McKenzie of 3408 Brookwood Drive. Their decorations are all in red and white. Lights of both colors are strung in the tree in front, as well as the shrubbery along the front of the house. A brightly lighted banner with Santa hangs between the front windows. The Santa theme is carried through the display, with a wreath and another Santa on the front door, and Santa and Mrs. Claus sculptures along the driveway. In a bed near the driveway are Santa, reindeer, and a candy cane. There are more red and white lights along the top of the driveway. The overall effect is a modern take on traditional themes.

For BEST LIGHTING, the award goes to Katie and Greg Koerner of 3404 Brookwood Drive. The design is simple, straightforward, and clean—and very colorful. The roof is outlined in large, multi-colored lights, matched by similar lights covering the bushes. The edge of the bed in front of the house also is lined in brightly colored lights. The multi-colored lights are dramatically offset by a small tree to the left of the house strewn in all vibrant blue and an obelisk in front decorated in all white. This house is a shining example of the light of the season!

For OVERALL EXCELLENCE, we were very excited to select a group of houses on Pinehurst Avenue from 9918 down to Country Hill Drive, as well as on Country Hill up to 3402. You can begin to see this display as you enter the community on Country Hill Drive from Old Lee Highway. There's a little of everything: white-light displays covering rooflines, trees, shrubs, and decks, along with colored lights, Nativity scenes, wreaths in windows, candy canes, illuminated snowman, bows and garlands, and projected light screens. The overall effect filled us with holiday cheer; we invite you to drive by and enjoy it as well.



November 2017 Beauty Spot of the Month

Congratulations to Carol Parry who lives at 3414 Park Hill Place! The Country Hills Garden Club has selected her front yard as the November Beauty Spot of the Month. The mature plantings surrounding her home accent its architectural design and add beautiful seasonal colors to its landscape scheme.

The attractive gazing ball placed at the top of the driveway reflects the beauty found in the Parry yard. A mix of evergreen and deciduous trees and shrubs creates the year-round curb appeal. At the front of the house, a thick, pruned hedge of azalea bushes complements the horizontal lines of the windows and brick wall. In contrast, a tall crepe myrtle and a holly freely grow toward the eaves at the wall corners. A stately arborvitae flanked by yew bushes highlights the distinctive picture window centered on the side addition. Hostas and azaleas are well-suited as companion plants in the shaded flower gardens close to the main entrance.

In November the colorful displays of ornamentals in the yard signal a change of seasons. At the driveway, fragile white summer flowers of a nandina bush have produced spectacular sprays of crimson berries. Along the side yard, dried hydrangea blossoms are edged with a dusty rose tint while dogwood branches show off their rich burgundy leaves and cherry-red fruit clusters. A floral arrangement of potted chrysanthemums and a pumpkin brings a festive touch to the front doorstep.

This month stroll through the CCH neighborhood for thrilling views of fall foliage! Be sure to stop at the Parry address to admire the impressive landscape enhanced by autumn's awesome special effects.
