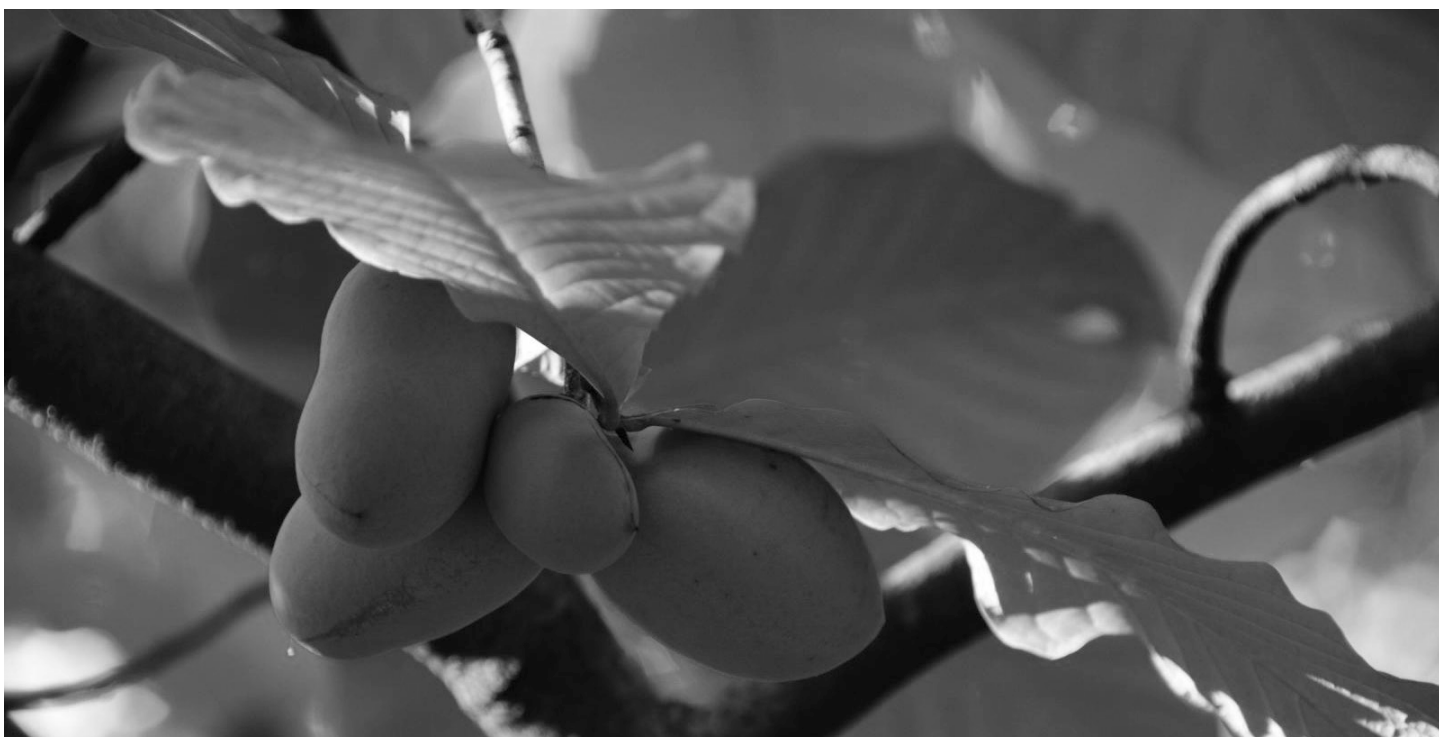

For the Common Good

From planting natives to removing invasives, your help is needed to keep our Commons Area healthy.

THE CCHCA IS LOOKING FOR volunteers to help with the continuing restoration of the Common Area wood edge. Thanks to generous grants from the City of Fairfax Community Appearance Committee in 2015 and 2018 we have made a great start at restoring the area to a native Virginia woodland.

The history of the patch of land we call the Common Area is uniquely tied to our neighborhood. The story is it was originally reserved by the developer for the swimming pool, obviously too small for that, the CCH neighborhood pool ended up in Old Lee Hills and we ended up with a small park adjacent to the Accotink Creek.

Over the years many CCH residents have devoted time and energy to planting and maintaining the woodland edge. The CCH Garden Club created the lovely garden on the east edge of the woodland has maintained it for many years now, and Nasrin and Steven Lescure care for the beautiful garden bed along the east border by the new bench. Former CCH resident Teresina Christy revived the garden near the pavilion and took the lead on re-introducing native plants such as bee balm, goldenrod, milkweed, bleeding heart and ragwort to the Common Area. Since Teresina moved two years ago the members of the Garden Club graciously continue to maintain the bed by the pavilion as well.

In 2015 it was brought to the attention of the Civic Association board that much of the Common Area woodland was being overrun by aggressive invasive plants. This is a common problem (no pun intended). Our parks and stream areas are filled with damaging and destructive plants that are killing trees and other plants, and reducing habitat and food sources for insects and animals. The extent of the problem is daunting and the damage is extensive. In coordination with the Garden Club the CCHCA agreed upon a strategy to reduce the invasive plant population by gradual removal of invasive plants and by the introduction of appropriate native plants. Our goal is to create a woodland edge that is a

beautiful, resilient and interesting patch of nature, that is a healthy habitat, that showcases some of our beautiful native plants so that neighbors can learn firsthand the benefits and beauty of native plants. It is the board's hope and expectation that if we successfully transform the area to a robust mix of native trees, shrubs and perennials, that the Common Area will ultimately be more self-sustaining and less demanding of its stewards' time and energy (and money) to maintain. We aren't the only association with woodland under its care, and it would be great if CCH can be an example of how it is possible for a community to protect and maintain a healthy woodland with minimal resources and a shared commitment.

With the 2015 grant we planted more than a dozen native trees, native shrubs and native perennials. We held work days to remove invasive plants and mulch the new plantings. Today, most of those trees and plants are thriving and already contributing to the habitat value of the woodland. Thanks to some knowledgeable neighbors, primarily Ariel Harwick and Teresina Christy, we applied for and successfully qualified for the Audubon Society's Wildlife Sanctuary Certification. I hope you all caught Ariel's terrific article in the Spring 2018 *Eccho* about the natural life of our woodland, if not, check it out on

the website at cchca.org under the news-letters tab.

In the past couple of years one volunteer in particular, Betty Russell, who is a member of the CCH Garden Club, has devoted many hours of her week to tending the gardens and woodland. If you walk or drive by the Common Area on any given morning you have most likely noticed Betty working away. She loves to share her enthusiasm for the park with any who come to visit.

This year the CCHCA Community Appearance committee received a second grant for additional woodland plantings. With this grant we added more than 20 species to the area — plants that would have grown there naturally if the woodland had not been disturbed by development. Of course, this is a drop in the bucket compared to what should and could be there, but it is a good start. Meanwhile, the invasive plants don't quit. In fact, as you may have noticed in your own yard, some seem to take removal as a signal that they need to up their game!

This terrific project still needs help. If you would like to help, please contact me. If you'd like to join the committee, or take on a specific project or just think you might be able to spare an hour here or there, let's talk! Even a small commitment can go a
