Subscribers continue to choose the route through which they will receive the alert (e-mail, cell phone text message) — but the city now can tailor messages to fit the particular resource — brief for texts, less so for e-mails, for example. Users also now may identify geo-graphical areas of interest on a city map, and subscribers will receive information the city sends specific to that area. Users also may now include their cell phone and Internet-service telephone numbers to receive voice messages from the Reverse 911 voice message service. This service is reserved only for emergen-cies or urgent situations. (Currently, the city receives a list of Verizon's landline numbers, which cell phone and Internet-phone providers do not provide.) Subscribers may continue to monitor their eMAS subscription from the home page — as well as directly from the updated address: emas.fairfaxva.gov _civic_association_elects.php)




