RECAP OF JANUARY MEETING. Several changes to the By Laws of the Civic Association were unanimously adopted at the January meeting. These changes provide for absentee voting to assure that all members of the community have an opportunity to express an opinion even if they are unable to attend a meeting. In the future, meetings are required to be held at least once every ninety days instead of monthly.

FEBRUARY MEETING The February meeting will be held at the Layton Hall school on Thursday 27 February at 8:00 P.M. Mrs. Ann Wilkins, a member of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, will present the reasons why this community should not be annexed by the Town of Fairfax in view of the county incorporation plan. The speaker is scheduled for 8:00 P.M.

STREET SIGNS. The Board of Directors has approved the project of repairing the present street signs. Bids have been submitted and the work is scheduled to start about the first of March. Signs will be replaced in the order of their proximity to the Old Lee Highway and according to the condition of present signs.

DUES. The \$2 annual dues of the Civic Association are used to publish this bulletin, for improvement and maintenance of community assets such as street signs, entry signs, etc., to supplement or provide funds for community dances and other social functions such as the annual Christmas childrens' party and in support of charitable organizations and community requirements as the occasion arises.
