Summary of November Meeting

Civic Association Aims The following program for the 1957-58 Civic

Association were presented to and unanimously endorsed by the 39

members present at the meeting:

A. Improve community appearance and facilities by cleaning up the perimeter areas of Country Club Hills, carrying on the tree planting program, installing new street signs and entrance markers, supporting the Recreation Association in building a swimming pool and by urging Fairfax County to improve street maintenance.

B. Promote social relationships by continuing support of the Little League, establishing a Teen Age Club and Junior Civic Association, sponsoring periodic dances and by keeping the membership informed of community activities through the Civic Association News Bulletin.

C. Preserve rights of the members of the Civic Association both householders and renters, by keeping members informed of current issues through factual programs concerning current community problems and by ensuring that we are represented at County and other meetings concerning such subjects as schools, sanitation, civil defense, incorporation, annexation, taxes and zoning (to include location of future airports, highways, hospitals, schools and industrial installations).

2. Organization To facilitate the dissemination of information and to insure that all members of the association have a personal point of contact with the board of directors, a system of "block captains", each of whom is responsible for representing a small group of homes "9 to 14") has been organized. 3. Absentee Voting A brief discussion was held concerning the pros and cons of absentee voting by the members of the Civic Assoc. The basic argument for this system is to insure that each member has a voice in determining community policies and actions when sickness, vacations, business or other problems and commitments prevent attendance at meetings to vote in person. The arguments against the system was that if a person does not have the interest to attend a meeting he should forfeit his right to vote, that a member who does not attend a meeting may not be aware of all facts since he would not hear the discussion and that this system would result in less attendance and interest. The system as proposed would provide a ballot as part of the News Bulletin which would be signed by the voting member and turned in at the regular meeting by his "block captain." A motion was passed to table the proposal until the next meeting.

TREES: The Campbell and Ferrara Nurseries will begin delivery and planting of crab apple trees on the (11th of Nov. Members who have contracted to have trees planted are requested to put out stakes showing the desired location by the 9th. STAKING INSTRUCTIONS It is requested that, to achieve fairly uniform spacing of trees, neighbors get together and try to space trees approximately 30 to 40 feet apart. Trees must be at least 10 feet from water meter stand pipes and should be located 10 to 15 feet from telephone and driveways as the spread of this tree at maturity is about 10 feet.

Planting instructions: Holes should be at least six inches wider than the root system and deep enough to contain roots without bending. (Hole should be about 18 inches in diameter and about 14 inches deep for these trees) Set trees so that graft is just above ground level. (Do not set too deep) After setting, fill hole half full of top soil or sieved soil from hole mixed with one third peat moss or mulch, pack earth around roots by hand, and fill with water. After water sinks in, fill hole with top soil or mixture, sprinkle one half cup of 5-10-5 fertilizer on top of the hole and water in. Put a layer of peat moss about one and a half inches thick around the tree to cover loose soil as a mulch. (CAUTION: Do Not mound mulch in center around tree trunk.)
