COMMUNITY TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

The Beautification Committee is working on the possibility of developing a community planting plan,,using either Japanese cherry, dogwood, or flowering crab for on the street planting. Watch for future announcements ---we hope to have a community as beautiful as any in Virginia.

IT'S JAPANESE BEETLE TIME AGAIN

Many of the new residents have inquired about a beetle-control program. There is no county program as such. Attached to this bulletin is information sent to us by JAPANESE BEETLE CONTROL of Leesburg. They have carried out a beetle-control program for us for the past two years. They estimate the cost of treatment at \$11.20 per property, figuring on two pounds of spore per property. Calculations are based on 1/4 pound treating 1000 square feet of property, not including house, drive, or outbuildings.

Fairfax Hardware has offered spore dust to the residents of Country Club Hills at a cost of \$4.00 per pound, application to be made by the individual homeowner. To take advantage of this offer, there must be a minimum of twenty five subscribers.

Your block worker will call on you shortly to discuss your choice and to collect the necessary charges.
