### **Trees Need Mulch!**

### Benefits of mulching.

Trees, grass and shrubs compete for the same water and nutrients that are available in the top foot of soil. Because grass roots colonize faster and take up more of the soil space, they capture significant amounts of the soil's nitrogen. Grasses also release antagonistic chemicals into the soil that slow the growth of tree roots. The phenomenon is referred to as allelopathy. Researchers have found that tree growth is marginalized when trees are grown in turfed areas compared to trees with mulched root systems. Mulching also benefits tree roots by improving the entry of water into the soil and conserving moisture lost through evaporation at the soil surface. Mulching improved soil fertility and structure by providing food for trees and by attracting beneficial soil organisms, such as earthworms and "good" fungi. Mulching mitigates soil erosion and soil compaction and protects roots susceptible to damage from lawn mowers or string trimmers.

### How to Mulch

Apply a two to four inch layer over the area around the trunk, extending out to the dripline or beyond. Because many of our trees are mature and enormous, mulching to the dripline may not be practical. Therefore, mulch to an area at least four to five feet in diameter around the trunk. However, it's very important to keep the mulch six inches away from the trunks of trees. Why? The base of the tree where the trunk flares out must be able to breathe oxygen. It suffocates in the continually moist environment produced by mulch (or soil from a change of grade that buries the flare) and leads to the death of the inner bark. When the inner bark dies, the tree is no longer able to send food to its roots and the roots eventually starve. The

Anhut family has lost a couple of mature oak trees in the past 15 years, their demise aided in part by the base of the tree buried in soil or mulch! If only I knew then what I have since learned!

### Type of Mulch

A well-aerated, composted organic mulching material is best for properly mulching a tree. Some of the preferred materials for mulching trees include bark, shredded wood or leaves, and pine needles. Fresh wood chips and sawdust (characterized by a light coloring) should not be used because their decomposition removes nitrogen from the soil, depriving a tree of nitrogen needed for growth. Most shredded wood mulch sold commercially has been composted or partially decomposed (dark color) and is an acceptable organic mulch material.

Mulching helps recreate the forest root-zone environment from which our trees evolved. Let's get busy and care for our valuable trees!

### RESTRICTIONS (Section One)

(1) That no noxious, dangerous or offensive trade or activity shall be permitted or maintained upon said lots, nor shall anything be done thereon which may be or become an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood; nor shall any hogs, cattle, livestock or fowls be kept, or animals for breeding purposes.
