DON'T FORGET! Van Dyck Farmers Market is open and well stocked with fresh fruits and vegetables, meat, bread, and plants every Tuesday 8-12. So good and sooo convenient.

NOISY NEIGHBORS may be better than nosy ones, but still...During the summer months more people take the fun outside and so remember to please protect your neighbor's tranquility by keeping noise to a minimum, especially after 11pm. Also, as a courtesy it is a great idea to give neighbors a heads up on any big party plans you have that might mean lots of cars parked on the street or lots of music and activity. Most people mind those inconveniences less if they know to expect them.

In city code-speak: "It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue, or cause to be made or continued any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the city." Also, on a related topic, city code prohibits "the erection (including excavating), demolition, alteration or repair of any building before 7:00 a.m. and after 6:00 p.m. on weekdays, before 8:30 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays and federal and state holidays, and at any time on Sundays".

If you have concerns about noise or questions about the noise ordinance you can call the Zoning Office staff at 703 -385-7820. The city also runs a neighborhood concerns hotline at 703-385-7800 or you can email complaints to complaints@fairfaxva.gov for any and all concerns about your neighborhood (except complaints about your vp of civic affairs - send those to me).

DON'T WANT that freebie newspaper\_<u>The Washington Examiner</u>? You are in luck. The publisher has formally agreed to honor stop delivery requests from homeowners. Email *www.washingtonexaminer.com* and click on "home delivery" or call 703-846-8500 and be sure to obtain a stop-order tracking number. If the paper is still being delivered after seven days the city's Community Relations Office (703-385-7855) will follow up on your behalf using that tracking number.

## Recycling News . . .

Recently a young member of our community created a survey and questionnaire regarding our neighborhood's understanding of the recycling program offered by the City. Many participants posed questions we decided to answer in this newsletter's recycling column. If you have any additional questions after reading this bit, please feel free to call Fairfax City Recycling department at 703.385.7995 or check out their website at <a href="http://www.fairfaxva.gov/RefuseRecycling/RefuseRecycling.asp">http://www.fairfaxva.gov/RefuseRecycling.asp</a>

The following items **CAN** and **should be** recycled by placing them into your blue bin. Items DO NOT have to be separated, but should be rinsed out.

- all plastics with any number on the bottom (lids/tops included!)
- any plastic grocery bags
- plastic wrap, aluminum foil
- card board (including: cereal boxes, pizza boxes, rinsed milk and juice cartons) folded if larger than the bin and placed near it on the sidewalk.
- Styrofoam and packing peanuts
- tin cans and lids
- wire hangers (even in a big jumbled mess!)

The following items **CANNOT** be recycled in the blue bins:

- paper towels
- small electric appliances

Take these to the Transfer Station - 4618 West Ox Rd. June 27<sup>th</sup> is the next *Electric Sunday* (normally the last Sunday of each month

• cell phones

• these can often be donated to various fund raisers or organizations reconfiguring them to help domestic abuse victims or the troops overseas

they can also be recycled at many retailers or service providers such as T-mobile, AT&T, Sprint, Staples, Office Depot, Best Buy, Verizon Wireless

It's summertime and with it comes the heat! Protect yourselves, your kids and your pets. Here are a few tips from the Red Cross:

- 1. Wear light colored and light weight clothing.
- 2. Drink lots of water. It's easy to dehydrate in hot weather.
- 3. Eat smaller more frequent meals.
- 4. Avoid strenuous activity in the heat and humidity.
- 5. Be a good neighbor and check on the elderly around you.

And one thing I want to personally emphasize, <u>never leave children or pets unattended in the car any time of the year.</u> In the summer, heat can kill quickly. Even a few minutes or seconds matter. Doors get locked accidentally, keys don't work or jam or entrance codes get forgotten – especially in tense situations.

Summer days and evenings are a fun time for all with people out and about. We have lots of children in the neighborhood as well as lots of adults that like to walk, many with their pets too. Please follow the posted speed limit and as a general safety precaution slow down when you see people and animals.

July 4th is just around the corner! Fireworks are fun to watch but can also be dangerous when not handled properly. Please be safe and follow the city rules. From a recent article in the Fairfax Cityscene, "Fireworks that explode, emit a flame or spark higher than 12 feet, or are projectiles, are banned in the city — even if they are available for sale elsewhere." The Cityscene article offers the following safety tips for fireworks:

-Light fireworks on flat surfaces, away from combustible materials, vehicles and buildings.

-Keep bystanders at least 25 feet away from fireworks.

-Do not permit children to handle or light fireworks.

-Do not throw fireworks.

If you just want to enjoy a fireworks show Fairfax City puts on a great one! This year it will be on July 3. For information or questions on fireworks, call 703-385-7830.

# Lawn Maintenance

Welcome to summer! If you are like me, one of the least-pleasant chores as the mercury soars is keeping that lawn cut. Unfortunately, there can be some pretty expensive consequences for failing to do so. When the city receives an ordnance violation complaint, they send an inspector to see if the grass is longer than six inches. The property owner is given ten days to trim it, and a second inspection is scheduled. If the tenth day falls on a Friday or Saturday, the inspector will usually wait until Monday to give the homeowner the extra weekend. he city's contractor will be sent out to mow if necessary, at a cost ranging from \$300 to \$1,000 depending on the size of the lawn and the length of the grass. This cost will be billed to the property owner; any costs not paid are automatically added to the property taxes. There are several reputable lawn services; if you are not able to mow your own lawn perhaps a neighbor can recommend one?
