# SCHOOL SITUATION TO DATE —

We continue to follow the developments. Most recently, the Fairfax County School Board agreed to place the Layton Hall School districting on their July 23 agenda A group of CCH residents attended this meeting at which Mrs. John Turtora, President of the Association was given the opportunity to present to the Board the pertinent facts which were outlined in our last BULLETIN. Additionally, some board members were made aware that the rooms available in Fairfax Elementary are so because the children they housed are being transferred to Layton Hall.

We learned that the new school construction will begin soon. The lowest bid was about \$40,000 higher than anticipated so the City Council appropriated the additional funds necessary. Completion is expected

by February 1st.

One interesting development was Mr. Funderburk's explanation of plans for the 400 students involved in waiting for completion of the New City Elementary school:

- 1. All first graders and most second graders will be double shifted at Layton Hall.
- 2. Seven classroom units will be transported to Fairfax Elementary School.
- 3. Three units will remain at Layton Hall

The County School Board will discuss all aspects of this problem and notify Mrs. Turtora of their decision. We have not received any further information as of this date.


