Our entrance signs at Brookwood and Old Post Road have been repaired; they had suffered damage due to snow plows.

Hope you all enjoy the upcoming fall season. I know that I'm happy the temperatures are cooling down some so I can get out and rake all those leaves coming down.

Thank you, Terry, for all your years of service to the neighborhood!

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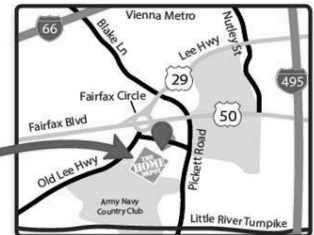

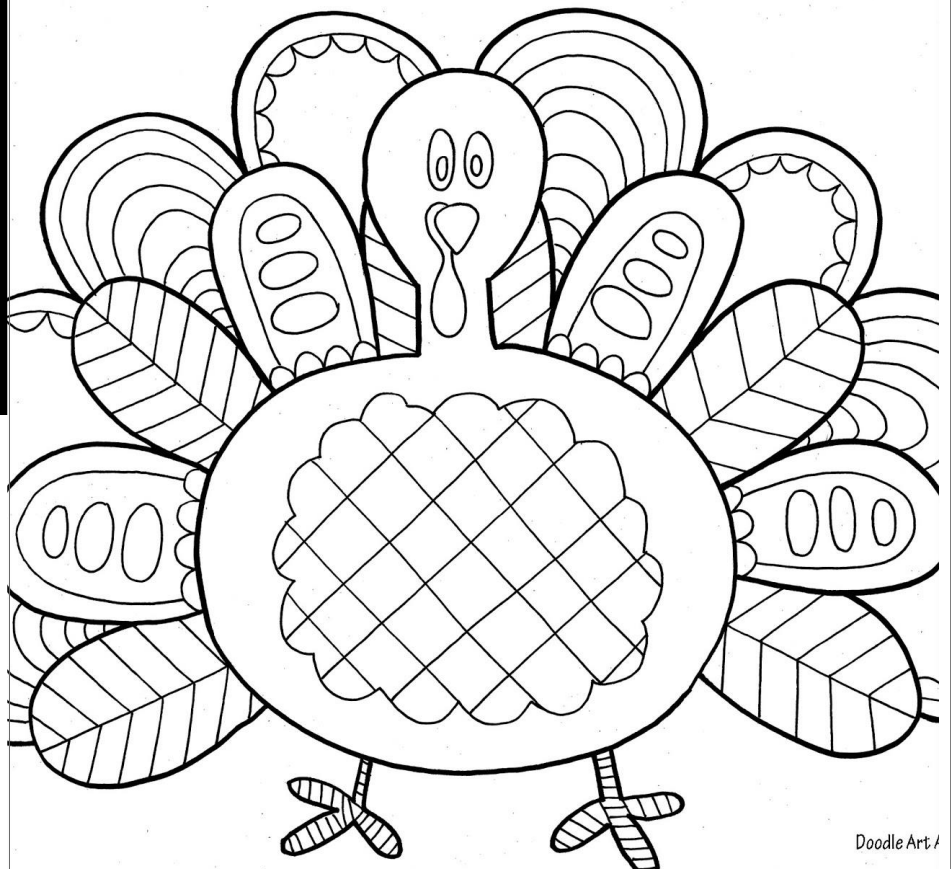

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Featured Beauty Spots

September 2017 Beauty Spot of the Month

Congratulations to the Whetzels who live at 3406 Park Hill Place! During September the CHGC sign for the Beauty Spot of the Month will spotlight their creative use of their front yard. By putting their imaginations and green thumbs to work, Jay and Lisa have converted their lawn area into a bountiful garden supplying their dining table with homegrown fruits and vegetables.

The Whetzels step into their garden paradise from their front door. Heavenly bamboo, Autumn Joy sedum, crepe myrtle, barberry, impatiens, and a Japanese maple tree add bursts of red, pink, and white around the stone patio that opens to the broad front yard. Along the slope to the left, lily turf lends its purple blossoms and pointed leaves as a fringed edging under lofty hardwoods and large evergreens. An unexpected sight in the middle of the lawn is a micro-orchard containing apple, plum, pear, peach, and cherry trees. Small bushes for figs, berries, and grapes line the parkway. Right of the driveway, a sun-drenched garden plot spreads out to the corners of the yard. During this summer, continuous blooms from daisies, zinnias, roses, and sunflowers attracted pollinators, as well as decorated rows of vegetable plants. Plentiful amounts of beans, corn, okra, squash, tomatoes, and peppers were picked at the peak of the season. Now that autumn is approaching, the Whetzels have cleared spent vines, pruned branches, and pulled weeds to make way for a fall harvest. The new season will bring tasty additions to their cornucopia when cooler temperatures foster new growth from rosemary, basil, collards, kale, Swiss chard, and Brussels sprouts. Home orchards and vegetable gardens require planning and hard work, but the time and effort yield great rewards. Imagine preparing nutritious meals from an amazing selection of fresh produce conveniently growing just steps from the kitchen! This September the Whetzels will savor the fruits of their labor in crisp salads, tasty main dishes, and delicious desserts!



October 2017 Beauty Spot of the Month

Congratulations to our neighbors, Olivia and Bill Alsbrooks of 3416 Country Hill Drive. They are the October 2017 Beauty Spot recipients. We have watched this yard for several years and are impressed by its beautiful, thoughtful landscaping. Repetition of pattern and texture, through plantings such as Japanese maple, rose bushes, nandina, lirioppe, and ajuga as groundcover, as well as the use of ornamental species, provides symmetry and adds uniqueness.

The bed in the center of the front yard sets the stage, with the spikiness and draping of weeping Norway spruce juxtaposed with lush dense leafage of euphorbia and ornamental grass that stands upright, swaying in the breeze. To the left of the driveway, the crepe myrtle, with its wonderful mottled limbs, harbors a Japanese maple in the understory, and rich, deep green, almost purple, patches of ajuga create a thick carpet of groundcover. To the right of the driveway, another Japanese maple anchors the bed, surrounded by leafy lirioppe, Nandina with bright red berries, and rose bushes. There are beds that run along the whole front of the house. Again Japanese maple, more rose bushes, dogwood, and nandina, and here, juniper ground cover, maintain the symmetry and accentuate the striking river birch, with its shredded papery bark, anchoring the far corner of the bed.

The beds bordering the walkway to the front porch have a variety of plantings: variegated japonica, globe-shaped boxwoods, pine, nandina, and ajuga. Around the corner of the house, leading to the back yard, a conical shaped boxwood stands at attention with purple geranium, leading you to the arbor covered with wisteria. The landscaping is enhanced by various garden ornaments interspersed throughout the beds, and assorted potted plants remind us of the beautiful colors of autumn. Do stop by and take a look. We are sure it will inspire you with ideas for your own yard to take it from ordinary to extraordinary!

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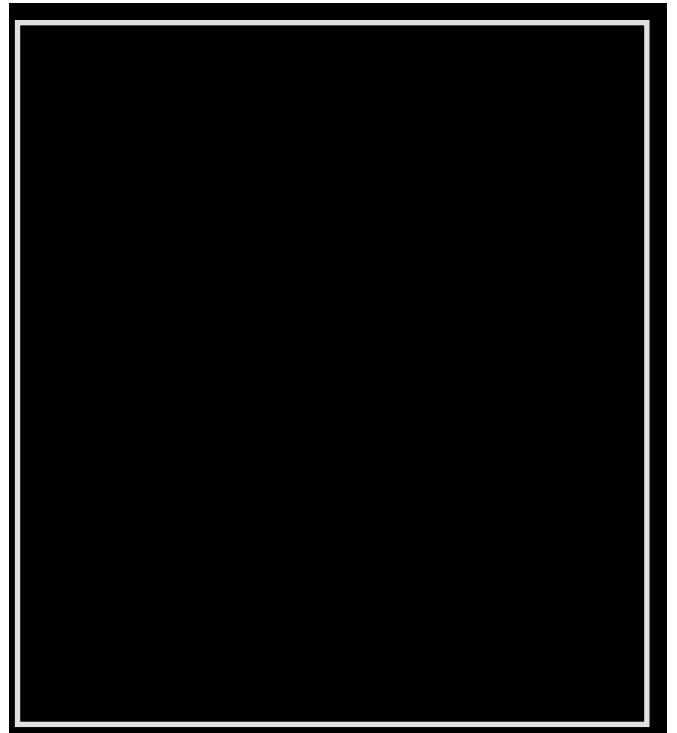
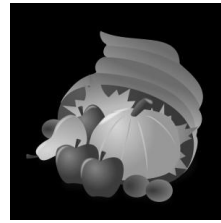
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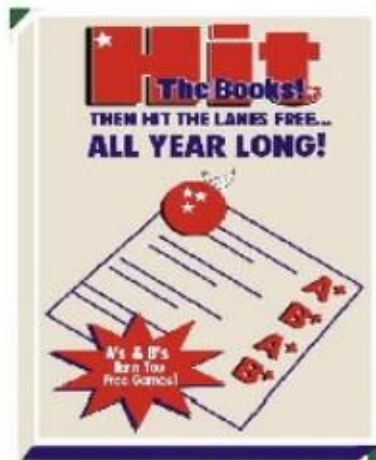


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Are you a member of CCHCA?

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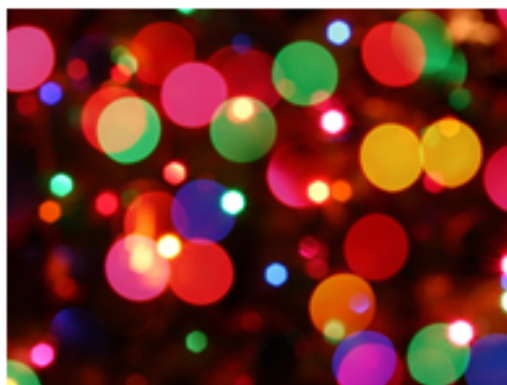
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COMMUNITY APPEARANCE

We have a wonderful stream coursing along our neighborhood, which you can enjoy from the Spring Lake Terrace path bridge or by following the woodsy paths at the common area. Our CCH stream is part of the Accotink Creek that winds its way down to Lake Accotink and eventually flows out to the Potomac River. When I was a kid we liked to make rafts out of twigs and grass blades and send them down the "river" of water in the street gutter that flowed during rainstorms. Maybe those rafts made it to the Potomac! Today, unfortunately lots of trash and debris enter the creek via the storm sewer system. In CCH the Civic Association hosts a stream clean up once or twice a year to reduce the amount of litter in the creek, and volunteers with Friends of Accotink Creek diligently tackle clean ups all along the tributaries of the Accotink in the spring and fall. But we can do our part every day by making sure that trash goes in the trash and that nothing manmade gets into the storm sewer inlets. In fact, something as ubiquitous as cigarette butts may be small but they are lethal. The butt of the cigarette contains all the harmful toxins that the filters are keeping out of the smokers' lungs - once in the stream many of those toxins simply, and fatally, leach into the water, and even the filters are not biodegradable these days and end up in the intestines and stomachs of aquatic animals. So not only is keeping our neighborhood trash-free aesthetically desirable but it is a simple way to protect our creek and its many inhabitants!
