Our work in the Commons this year begins our multi-year project toward sustainability and native plants. Besides weeding, edging and mulching the whole area, we will begin a concentrated effort on the area in front of the sign, clearing out the plants that grow too tall and planting sedges and other native ground covers and plants that will require less maintenance in the future and support local wildlife.

We are also purchasing a group of native seedlings and will be preparing the ground for their planting later in May.

Thank you to all who have made donations specifically to upkeep of the Commons. Your generosity is helping make this project possible! We are excited to begin and know that we and our furry and feathered neighbors will benefit for years to come.




save the Date! 2015 CCHCA ANNUAL MEETING




