AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION:

The following amendment will be brought to the floor at the next regular meeting for discussion and action:

Article III, Section 1: The officers of this Association shall consist of a president, vice-president, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, and a treasurer.

This is brought to the floor because of the increased work load for one secretary.

ORDINANCE FOR THE CONTROL OF RAILS AND DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE:

The following sections of this Fairfax County ordinance have been called to our attention:

Section 2: It shall be unlawful for an owner to permit his dog to run at large within the boundaries of Fairfax County, and the owner shall keep his dog confined to his premises.

Section 7: The owner of a dog which has bitten a person, or any person having knowledge of any dog which has bitten a person, shall immediately notify the Police Department of Fairfax County. The Health Officer of Fairfax County shall immediately examine said dog, and in his discretion:

(b) Place said dog in the custody of a licensed veterinarian, or licensed veterinary hospital for a period of ten days.

(c) Chain or confine said dog in a strong enclosure on the owner's premised and isolated from all other animals for a period of ten days.

These ordinances have been enacted for the protection  
of all residents of Fairfax County. Because of the increased work
