NEIGHBORHOOD HISTORY

Ever wonder why so many things are named “Daniels” around our neighborhood?

OK, probably not. I was curious though, so I asked some



questions at the Virginia Room at the Fairfax City Library. Elaine McRey kindly provided a wealth of information.

The library has maps back to 1760 that document the land-owners in the County. Highlighted in yellow below is the land parcel owned by John O'Daniel, who probably inherited or bought it from William O'Daniel. This parcel would eventually become Fairfax City. (Or at least a good bit of it. It seem Frances Summers owned a piece too, but that's a story for another day.)

So why isn't everything named “O'Daniel”? According to a video posted on the *Daniels Run* Elementary School's website, William's ancestors dropped the Celtic “O” from the name in the early 1800's.

So – shouldn't all the signs around town read Daniel's (with an apostrophe)?

Pastel flowers dot rose of Sharon, crepe myrtle, hydrangea, butterfly, and hibiscus bushes. Brilliant blossoms top the slim stems of black-eyed Susans, marigolds, zinnias, gladioli, and cannas. Now at mid-summer, the bright white of the trumpet lily stands out midst the surrounding riot of color. Many more flower varieties await your discovery. September, 2018 Beauty Spot of the Month

This September the Country Hills Garden Club has chosen the attractive landscape at the Clukey house at 10105 Cornwall Road as the Beauty Spot of the Month. The curb appeal of this ranch-style house is enhanced by a blend of trees, shrubs, flowers, and garden accents of complementary scale. At the front wall of the house is a row of alternating azalea and rhododendron shrubs. During this late summer season, visual excitement comes at the row's end where fuchsia pink blossoms cover a tall, bushy crepe myrtle. A pretty grapevine wreath attached to the brick wall brings a touch of country charm to the landscape. Two ornamental cherry trees, different in size and shape, are prominently positioned in the foreground. One with weeping branches serves as the focal point in the right side yard. To the left, an upright cherry tree shades a wide flower bed. Purple petunias and red and white impatiens spread over the dark mulch with their funnel-shaped flowers turned toward the afternoon sun. Long stemmed pastel roses grow nearby as their companion plants. Across the landscape, summer-themed garden stakes, flags, and flower baskets extend a cheery welcome to visitors. When you stop to admire this CCH yard, don't be surprised if you catch sight of a fluttering hummingbird or butterfly!

holly and azalea shrubs along the house walls provided a verdant green backdrop to lavender and pink floral sprays filling blue containers. Although September's weekly rains have strengthened stems and coaxed new growth, harbingers of the fall harvest season are the main attractions of this October garden. Mother Nature has applied bold brush strokes from her rich autumn palette. Dogwood leaves are edged claret red. Branches of a stately spruce tree are laden with glossy green needles and umber cones. November, 2018 Beauty Spot of the Month

The Country Hills Garden Club is pleased to honor Joyce and Len Skoglund's landscape at 3415 Country Hill Drive as the November, 2018 Beauty Spot of the Month. As a Gardening Consultant, Joyce is familiar with the elements of good landscape design and the plants compatible with Virginia soil and climate. The Skoglunds have used this knowledge to create spectacular year-round views of flowers and foliage outside their windows. At the end of the growing season, curving garden beds bordering house walls and walkways feature dramatic differences between plant forms and textures. Prickly needles of upright cactus and conifers are juxtaposed with delicate arching fern fronds. Symmetrical evergreens overlook shape-shifting ornamental grass. Silvery green sword-like blades of iris and yucca contrast sharply with dark green, oval leaves of camellia and azalea. Nighttime chills followed by daylight warm ups bring the panoply of autumn color to the yard. Dogwoods with ruby red leaves shimmering on gracefully posed limbs lure visitors nearer for a close look at garden accents and seasonal transformations. Arbor arches and yard art harmonize with natural shapes and shades. Reddish-purple pods hang from a hyacinth bean vine. Gold-brushed leaves glow on a witch hazel shrub. Bronzed florets crown sedum stems and Joe-Pye Weed stalks. Yellow and copper chrysanthemums, ornamental cabbages, and pied pansies will brighten urns and borders through the Thanksgiving holiday. Does this striking landscape inspire you to consider adding something new to your garden? It's not too late to display a fall-themed wreath or to plant spring flowering bulbs!

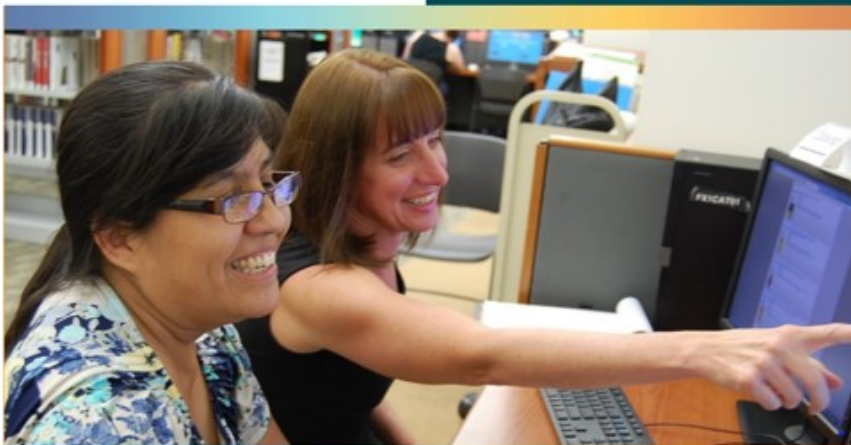
