PRESIDENT’S MESSAGE

I hope everybody is enjoying the beautiful fall weather we’ve been having. The neighborhood always looks so nice this time of year as our mature trees turn color.

CCHCA has been in touch with the Mayor and members of the City Council on the many extended power outages CCH experienced this summer. Power issues have been a problem in the neighborhood ever since my family moved-in in 1990, and I’m sure it goes back much longer. It’s a very frustrating issue, and dealing with a behemoth like Dominion is difficult. Our City government has been very responsive to our queries and is trying to push Dominion to respond.

The City brought in Dominion officials to their last work session to discuss the issue. CCHCA Treasurer Toby Sorensen attended the session. Although nothing has been decided, the City has promised to continue to press the issue with Dominion. They are also hiring a consultant to help them develop a strategy. CCHCA will continue to ask for updates and an action plan.

On a more positive note. The Country Hills Garden Club organized a farewell party at the Commons for Betty Russell, who is moving to Pennsylvania soon. Everybody that goes by the Commons on a regular basis knows Betty, or at least has seen her working away down there. She has done a truly amazing job. We all owe her a debt of gratitude. A new bench was installed in her honor adjunct to the park sign. Thanks to the Garden Club and the City for their efforts to obtain the bench.

As of this writing, plans are underway for the annual Halloween Party and the visits from Santa. We are also trying to organize a Social Hour down at the Commons. Information on all these events will be forthcoming.

The vast majority of homes in the neighborhood are well maintained. There are a few that, hum, are not. Several neighbors have asked if the City has a policy in this area. The short answer is “yes”. The City has what is called a Property Maintenance Code that they enforce. More information is inside. I personally would encourage neighbors to have some patience before making reports. Sometime life can get in the way of home maintenance.

Google-Group Guidelines 2019

Posting: cchca@googlegroups.com

To join our CCHCA Google-Groups please email: ggmoderator@cchca.org or ggmoderator2@cchca.org

Please Note: Only members of the CCH Civic Association have the privilege to post messages. A non-member resident is allowed one posted message, and shall be reminded of the Google-Group guidelines, and invited to join CCHCA.

The Google group is a valuable service to our neighborhood. The primary role of the Google group is to provide the CCHCA a quick and efficient means of communication to a large majority of households on matters of importance to the neighborhood.

The guidelines strike a balance between accommodating individual requests to reach neighbors while maintaining the Association's ability to reach as many residents as possible quickly. From past experience, overuse of the Google group for individual needs can cause some neighbors to unsubscribe in turn reducing the overall effectiveness of the group as a means of communication.

The following guidelines shall be used when posting and responding to Google group messages:

1. Limit topics to pertinent local information of interest to CCH residents
2. Do not post the City's routine message, which are included in its many public publications
3. Provide email address for replies; phone numbers are optional. Do not include business/company signatures or footers or any marketing.
4. Post only one message per event/issue. Combine several messages into one post. For CCHCA and Historic Blenheim events more than one post is permitted.
5. Post items for sale by CCH residents excluding items belonging to third parties or commercial entities.
6. Reply to posted email address if shown in the message, otherwise click on "reply", **NOT "reply all."**

7. Do not post:

"Thank you", "Good job!", "Dog/cat has been found" or "Item no longer available" messages but reply to each responder individually.

Charity solicitations, political, religious, sexual and commercial messages.

Messages on behalf of non-CCHCA member or items for sale or rent outside the limits of the CCH community.

8. Please visit our website for recommended contractors, pet and babysitters before requesting recommendations via the Google-Group
9. Please consider using the community facebook page for communications that do not fall within these guidelines.

All messages are screened by the moderators before group delivery to assure adherence to these guidelines. The moderators make the final decision. If approved, your message will be usually posted within one hour but extend 12 hours, however, the moderators cannot guarantee posting by a certain time.

If you have any questions or are uncertain about something you would like to post, please contact the group moderators at <mailto:ggmoderator@cchca.org> Suggestions for revision and appropriateness will be

FAIRFAX COURT HOUSE-- 150 YEARS AGO

The Village of Providence, or Fairfax Court House (now City of Fairfax) is 16 miles from this City. The trains on the Orange railroad leave here for Fairfax Station, within three miles of the Court House, twice daily at 7AM and 11PM, connecting with a stage coach for the Court House. The fare for the round trip, including all charges being \$1.75.

Lock Your Car

Don't leave items such as GPS units, cell phones, cameras, MP3 players, laptop computers, purses, wallets and other valuables in your car.

If you must leave valuables in your car, such as when you're traveling, make sure things are hidden **before** you get to your destination. After all, it doesn't do much good to hide your valuables if the thief watches you and then waits for you to leave your car before breaking in.

It sounds simple, but you really can fight crime every day just by locking your car, taking your keys, and hiding your valuables.

It will make the City of Fairfax an even better and safer community and it may save you a lot of time, aggravation and money.

The best way to fight crime is to prevent it from happening in the first place.

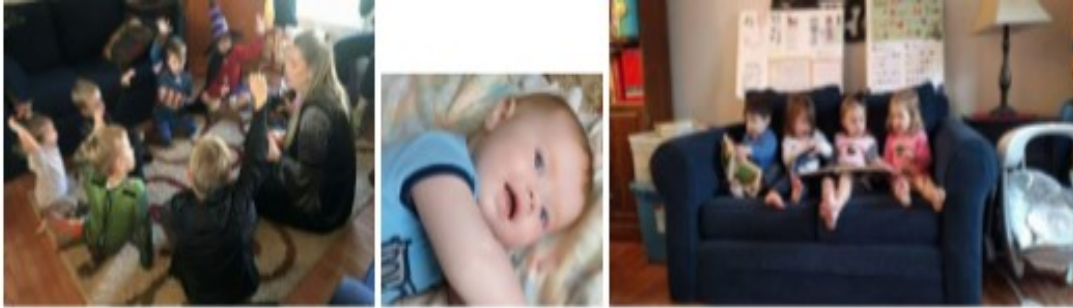

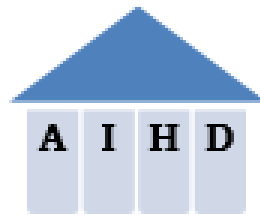
