COVID has put the kibosh on most CCHCA activities. We will not be having the normal Labor Day picnic. We are kicking around some alternative ideas. Stay tuned to the Google and Facebook groups for more information.

CCCHA did sponsor a virtual public meeting with the City about the proposed Connector Trail that would run from the new fire station to the Commons. At the meeting, several member of the City staff, including the Director of Transportation and the Director of Parks and Recreation,

described the proposed project and their reasoning for recommending it. Several Council members were also present. The meeting was well attended and provided an opportunity for neighbors to voice their concerns and opinions about the project.

Ultimately, the City Council voted to move the project forward to the funding phase. Note that this is a long-term project. Even if it is funded, no actual construction will occur for a number of years. The City has assured us that we will be included in the design phase of the project should it get that far.

Many are probably aware that the City is also working on a project to make improvements to Old Lee Highway. The plan includes bicycle lanes, upgraded pedestrian and transit amenities and improved

landscaping and buffering. This project will certainly have an impact on our neighborhood and will need to be carefully monitored.

Other news. Neighbor Leslie Cullen designed, printed, and distributed custom t-shirts to the graduating seniors in the neighborhood. They came out very nice!

CCHCA has been coordinating with our neighbor association, Old Lee Hills, to schedule Food Trucks for the community. The City worked with us to correct a homeless encampment that was developing in the woods behind Spring Lake Terrace.

Civic Affairs Update *by Hildie Carney*

I have volunteered to be the CCH rep for the Old Lee Highway project. Please send me any thoughts or concerns or suggestions you have on that project by September 15th for the 1st meeting.

For those of you that are renting your house or a portion of it, there are some guidelines from the City that are important to know. No short term rental is permitted. You can have one family or up to 3 unrelated persons sharing the home. In owner occupied rentals, the owner and renters must share the common kitchen and living areas. You must obtain a business license. For more info fairfaxva.gov.

There is a lot of development projects going on in the City: some

that may pertain to us are (1) Capstone Student Housing on Democracy Ln. Developer preparing to release the plan for submission in the Fall. (2) Courthouse Plaza: owners, Combined Properties, plans to redevelop area including former McDonalds and Joe's Pizza, retaining the Eastern end of the Shopping Center and grocery store but adding multi-residential homes. (3) McDonalds at Fairfax Circle to add a drive-thru lane. (4) Also at Fairfax Circle "Scout at the Circle" development is underway.

Have some fun and get some people (proper distancing) together and "go" (virtually) to the Mayor's Ball on August 29. Originally scheduled for May, this fundraiser is to support the City of Fairfax Band Association

and Fairfax Spotlight on the Arts. The online gala will include a silent auction. For more info email Megan DuBous, megan.dubois@fairfaxva.gov.

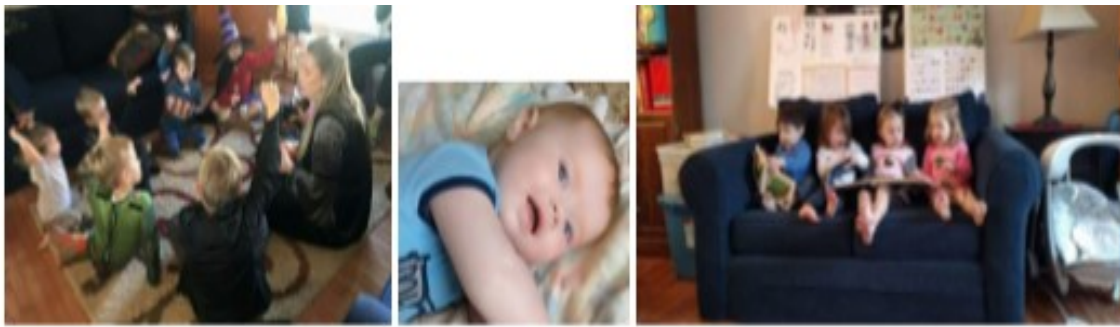

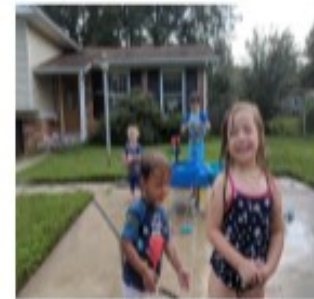

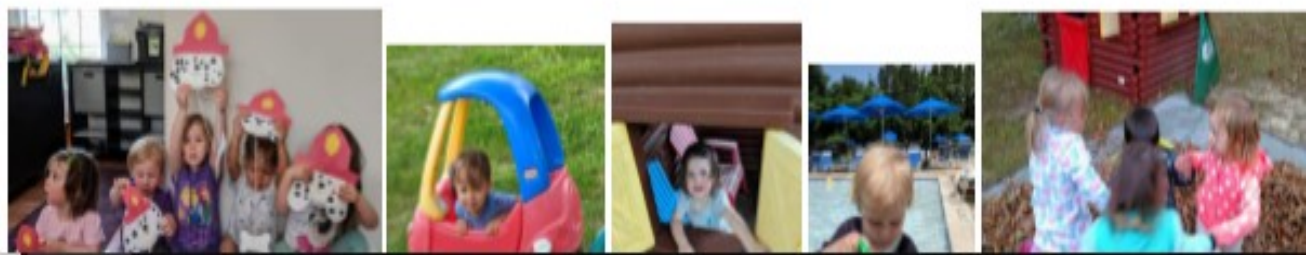

Garden Club News *by Nancy LeBow*

I've been noticing that I have a couple of dogwood trees that are dying and need removed. I'm planning to replace them this fall. Trees and shrubs are stressed less when planted when they are going dormant. We usually think about planting in the spring, but the summer heat and dry weather stresses new trees and shrubs especially in their first few years. If you're inattentive as I sometimes am, you don't usually have to water in the fall/winter, at least not as much as you do in the spring/summer.

I didn't plan to plant any vegetables this year. But the coronavirus came along and suddenly everyone was planting their vegetable gardens including my kids. Both my daughter and son gave me seedlings. I decided to be a good sport and plant them. Only I was busy with my new landscaping and moving plants around. I noticed that the seedlings were struggling but I ignored them other than watering. I thought I was going to kill them with neglect before I got them planted. How embarrassing it would be if they died when you are "Mom the Gardener." I

finally got the seedlings (three tomatoes and a squash of unknown variety) planted mid-June. I also planted one Italian globe eggplant. I was still reworking my new landscaping scheme so I pretty much ignored the vegetables.

Last week, I realized that I needed to harvest an eggplant and then this week another. The tomatoes being tomatoes are setting tomatoes and I will soon have to defend them from the squirrels and chipmunks. Yikes, what is that vine that is all over my lirioppe, stone steps and growing into the grass? It's the squash and it is even setting some funny shaped yellow squash. So they are thriving in spite of my neglect. Mostly they got some weeding and some watering.

I've read that gardening is cheaper than therapy and you get tomatoes—that is if the chipmunks leave you any. One way to keep your vegetables for yourself is to plant what you like but the critters don't. So now that fall is creeping up on us, it's time to think of what to plant this month and next. I don't usually grow

fall vegetables, but this year I may try a few radishes, parsley, lettuce and turnips. I've grown garlic, brussels sprouts and kale in past years. The brussels sprouts and kale attract cabbage worms so I've had to use an organic spray because I want my vegetables all for myself. The best turnips I ever ate were the ones I grew myself. They taste sweeter when they are harvested after a light frost. I don't know all that much about vegetable gardening, but I'll gladly share my limited knowledge and opinions with you. Feel free to ask.

I've so enjoyed my gardening this year. It has brought me peace to lose myself in the garden even if it is just pulling weeds. I hope you also have enjoyed your home and garden during these difficult times as much as I have. I've talked to more neighbors this year while gardening in my front yard than I have since I moved here in 1987.

Dominion Power Memo *by Mayor David Meyer*

In response to concerns expressed by City elected officials and electricity customers within the City of Fairfax, within the next two weeks Dominion Energy will initiate a Strategic Underground Project (Project # 10317283) for approximately 29 residences on Farr Drive, Country Hill Drive, and Pinehurst Avenue. Electric lines on the street will be placed underground, as will service to these specific residences. Dominion has obtained individual easements for these homes.

This work is scheduled for completion by December 31, 2020, weather permitting. Once the underground service has been completed, Dominion will remove the electric power lines from the top of the utility poles along the street

where these residences are located. Removal of the overhead lines is scheduled for completion by January 31, 2021, weather permitting.

Please note that the electric power lines that will be replaced with underground lines are the lines at the very top of these poles. The heavier wiring on the lower parts of these poles are communication wires (telephone, cable, internet). These wires are not under the jurisdiction of Dominion Energy. These wires and the poles they are on will remain.

Please also note that while the undergrounding of electricity lines at these residences will enhance electric reliability in the neighborhoods in close proximity to these streets, these improvements

will not guarantee uninterrupted service. The intent of this work is to reduce the frequency of outages or, when a power loss does occur, that the outage will be of a shorter duration.

In addition, Dominion Power has significantly trimmed several trees along Old Lee Highway to reduce the frequency of power outages resulting from tree limbs damaging power lines.

City Of Fairfax Cancels Public Events Through November

The City of Fairfax has made the difficult decision to cancel major public events through November 2020.

Press release from the City of Fairfax:

August 19 2020

The City of Fairfax has made the difficult decision to cancel major public events through November 2020. Limitations on crowd sizes and adherence to social distancing guidelines make holding large, popular events nearly impossible. The decision is supported by the mayor and city council.

"COVID-19 has forced the cancellation of almost every large and small event in the D.C. metro area, so our announcement probably won't come as a surprise to city residents," said Cathy Salgado, parks and recreation director. "Still, we are aware of the impacts to our vendors and local businesses that count on the large influx of visitors these events draw. It's disappointing, but the universal opinion is that holding these events in the current public health climate just isn't feasible. Staff enjoys holding these events almost as much as the people enjoy attending them, and we are hopeful that our events will return next year."

Canceled events include:

- Rock the Block concerts (August-October)
- Beer in the Burbs (September 5)
- Fall Festival (October 10)
- Holiday Craft Show (November 21-22)

Staff will wait until later this fall to assess whether it is possible to hold the Holiday Market and Festival of Lights and Carols events.

The Labor Day Car Show will be held as a wave parade on September 7. Approximately 30 cars will roll through Fairfax City streets. Details of the timing and route have not been finalized yet.

The 2020 Spotlight on the Arts Festival will be held August 27 through September 5, with a mix of virtual and small, in-person events.

A virtual shopping and information bazaar to connect vendors and non-profit organizations with city residents is under consideration.

The Town of "Providence" began to grow with the moving of the Fairfax County's courthouse from Alexandria to now Fairfax. The town's founder, Richard Ratcliff, purchased 18 lots in the immediate area knowing the town would grow because of the Courthouse events.

With our confinement to the outdoors, what a great time to explore our Historic District. Many of these sites are open during special events in the City.

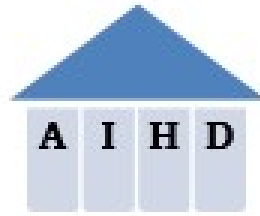
