# Transportation is all around us!

I hope everyone has been enjoying a pleasant summer and finding time to relax with friends and family. As summer hits the final stretch I am writing an extended president's letter in this issue of the ECCHO to give an update on two major City projects that are headed our way. These projects have been presented publicly and have the support of the current City Council and Mayor. CCH residents are divided in their support for these projects.

We will have a new mayor this year (David Meyer, the incumbent, has decided not to run) and at least two new City Council members. While transportation plans continue from one council to the next, new leadership brings new perspectives to the table. Please make your voice heard about these projects, especially during the current campaign season (and vote on November 8!)

The first project, the Old Lee Highway makeover, was presented at our annual meeting on June 8 by the City's Transportation Director, Wendy Block Sanford. The planning for the revamped Old Lee is well underway. CCH attendee asked Ms. Sanford several questions including about traffic management during what is likely to be an extended construction period. While Ms. Sanford pledged to work closely with the neighborhood, she reported that nothing concrete has been developed yet. All we know for sure is that Old Lee traffic that can't be detoured will need to be routed through Old Lee and CCH neighborhoods one way or another. Managing construction while handling traffic may mean the project takes longer as well. Ms. Sanford noted that they are considering allowing nighttime construction. This project, per Ms. Sanford, has been on the City's to do list since before she arrived here. She stated the overhaul wasn't due to any concerning safety data, and ultimately it wasn't clear why the facelift for Old Lee is happening. Much of it will be paid for by regional transportation funds – still us taxpayers, but not funds we have control over. Old Lee will have separate bike and pedestrian lanes which we can hope will eventually make the walk/ride safer and more pleasant. Not sure where the higher speed motorized scooters and e-bikes fit in, but probably they will share the bike lanes alongside the slow pokes, huffing and puffing on old fashioned bikes.

The second project is the CCH Connector Trail which will connect our neighborhood to Route 50 for anybody on foot or on a bike/scooter/e-bike/wheelchair. This project is slated to begin construction in 2028 if it is awarded funding but planning is happening now. The stated goal of this project is "to encourage non-vehicular local trips" (who knew my trips to Freddy's were clogging up the city's arteries as well as mine!)

This \$10 million dollar project was added to the city's transportation projects although it doesn't show up on the city's 2014 trails plan or its multi-modal plan. It is unclear how/why we ended up with a "connector trail" in this location but here it is:

That it is called the Country Club Commons Connector Trail, when, as far as I know, the CCHCA has never requested a connector trail is another mystery. The fact that it has been fleshed out now and will require bulldozing many large trees and disturbing a sensitive wetland area with a concrete boardwalk about 700 feet long and 16' wide elevated the whole way on concrete piers, in addition to a 65' long, 16' wide steel truss bridge over the stream, can be filed under "Best Laid Plans".

#### Some concerns that have been raised:

- Even though the woodland area is less than 300' wide at this point, the trail is 700' long because of the steepness of the slope on the Route 50 side. In addition to adding cost, the length also means a great deal more disturbance and tree loss in an already fragile woodland. The area is a highly sensitive Resource Protection Area, which is required to remain undisturbed except for very limited exceptions that are necessary for the common good.
- The entrance to the "trail" is proposed to be alongside the CCH pavilion. Because it is an elevated walkway with guard rails, the structure and its stormwater facility will cut the pavilion off from the rest of the common area. (See plan). The total width of the final installation adjacent to the pavilion appears to be about 26'. As proposed, the trail will also destroy several trees, including oak, hickory, redbuds and serviceberries, that the CCHCA has planted in that area. Moving the trail to a different location in the common area will only lengthen the trail and increase the amount of destruction.
- The funds for this adventure will be provided primarily through a regional transportation fund (taxpayers) although staff time for queuing this up is on the city's (taxpayer's) dime which also means opportunity costs of not putting that staff time to better use. While receiving grants to pay for things is great, it also means that we as a city have less flexibility over how the project is designed and built. The city (yes, taxpayers) will have to pay for all future maintenance and liability.
- How will snow and maintenance be handled? Recreational trails are generally not cleared, but as this is a transportation roadway for non-vehicular trips will it be maintained like a roadway? Will snow, leaves and ice be cleared or will it be a use at your own risk roadway? As an elevated concrete boardwalk, it will freeze before the ground will de-icing agents be used? If so, how will they not further pollute the stream? And does the city have the means, the will and the manpower to keep this (and others) safe and in good repair?

Value: Who is going to use this trail? Will a trail from the common area to route 50 be useful to you? I like to go for a spin on my bike, but I don't think a 700-foot-long boardwalk sounds inviting and biking across or along 50 is downright unpleasant. Will someone in a wheelchair drive to the common area to use this trail to then traverse route 50? A quiet woodland path already connects us to Route 50. The best way to increase non-vehicular traveling is to make the City's streets safer for bicyclists and pedestrians to use and to cross.

And there's more! Another trail is in the not-yet-approved Fairfax Boulevard Master Plan and shown in the Parks and Recreation Trails Plan which runs along the stream through everyone's backyard along the stream. That one simply needs to be erased from the to do list before anybody thinks about trying to build it.

Please discuss these projects with council and mayor candidates when they come knock on your door this fall. If there is interest in a community discussion, we can set up a meeting with city leaders and staff.

Everyone wants to live in a neighborhood that is pleasant, safe and friendly – thank you all so much for making CCH all of that and more!

# City Events Update by Hildie Carney



# NATIVE PLANTS



# WHAT'S ALL THE BUZZ?

Native plants are plants that naturally occur in the area they are found. Our native plants have evolved to thrive in Virginia clay, no amendments needed. They require less water and are wonderfully equipped to deal with our crazy weather. Native plants require less of our time and energy fussing over them.

The most important role of native plants is to support the food web. The Monarch's relationship to milkweed is a good example of a host-specialist relationship. The Monarch caterpillar can only feed on milkweed, without it they cannot exist. "Over 90% of herbivorous insects specialize on one or a few native plant lineages." <a href="https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pmc/articles/PMC6233133/">https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pmc/articles/PMC6233133/</a>.

If these native host plants are no longer grown, their specialist insects cannot exist.

According to NPR, "Habitat loss, pesticides and climate change are threatening insect populations worldwide. In 2019, *Biological Conservation* reported that 40% of all insects species are declining globally and that a third of them are endangered."

The great Naturalist, E.O. Wilson wrote:

"If all mankind were to disappear, the world would regenerate back to the rich state of equilibrium that existed ten thousand years ago. If insects were to vanish, the environment would collapse into chaos."

Doug Tallamy, an Entomologist out of the University of Delaware, and author of several books, gives us some simple things we can do to help slow down what is being called the Insect Apocalypse.

- 1) Reduce the size of our lawns.
- 2) Replace ornamentals with native species.
- 3) Remove invasive species.
- 4) Reduce light pollution by turning off outdoor lights at night.

#### **UPDATE ON APPEARANCE AT THE COMMONS**

As most of you have noticed, last year we lost some trees along the curb area at The Commons. These were Bradford Pear trees. They are very invasive and, in fact, many jurisdictions are removing them for that reason alone. I met with the Parks and Recreation Manager and the City Arborist to discuss the changes that will be taking place at The Commons. We had a good discussion and we agreed to the following:

- Remove the remaining damaged Bradford Pear. The stump will also be drilled out.
- Drill out the remaining stump of one of the damaged trees that was taken down.
- In October, we will be planting replacement trees.
- Leave the two Red Maples which are along the curb area and are perfectly healthy.

There will be an Oak tree planted in the area of the dog bag-box The tree will be moved back a little more than the previous Bradford Pear. We will also be planting a deciduous, large species Crape-myrtle at each end of The Commons but far enough from the proposed path to Route 50 so as not to interfere. Here is where the neighborhood can help (please email Jeskog612@gmail.com with responses):

- For the Oak tree, we have a choice of a WHITE OAK (Quercus alba), a RED OAK (Quercus rubra), or SCARLET OAK (Quercus coccinea). All oaks are wind-pollinated and there are no consistent differences in flowers between species of oaks.
- For the Crape-myrtle, we have a choice of color: white, pink, red or dark purple.

These improvements will take place in Oct. and I expect to have a mulch spreading in Nov. I will also need help in keeping the new trees watered. Please let me know if you will be able to help out and to beautify our space. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to me.
