The Elections Are Over, the Leaves Are Coming Down And Those Free Newspapers Are Blooming Again

This past congressional election in our district was a great example of the old saying that every vote counts. The election of our representative to the United States Congress was determined by less than 1,000 votes - probably about the population of our neighborhood (or about 1/10th of the number of leaves on our patio).

That time of year... leaves should be raked to the curb for suction truck pick up. The city doesn't want any leaves in bags. Vacuuming will continue through mid to late December. The crew's method is to start at one end of the city and go all the way through as many times as they can during the two months. Optimistically we'll see them once every two weeks, weather and leaf volume being the variables. Some extra things that are helpful: please try to keep branches and trash out of the leaf piles and don't pile leaves "upstream" of storm sewer inlets. The goal is to keep great quantities from entering the storm sewer system during rainstorms.

When snow comes, it is a good idea to also keep snow piles downstream from inlets and keep inlets clear. If you have a hydrant on or near your property the Fire Department appreciates neighborhood efforts to keep them cleared after snowfall as well. And now's the time to make sure your shovels and gloves are ready to go!

Freebie newspapers have been showing up again on CCH driveways and lawns. If you are once again receiving newspapers you don't want, submit a stop delivery request to the Washington Examiner email www.washingtonexaminer.com and click on "home delivery" or call 703-846-8500 and be sure to obtain a stop-order tracking number and hold onto it even once the newspaper deliveries stop. If they don't stop after two weeks, or reappear, send your address and the date of your original stop delivery request, with the tracking number if you have it, to chriscohen@fairfaxva.gov or call her at 703-385-7947.

It's the holidays and time for fun and good cheer with friends and family! It's also a time to stay safe. Each year, hospital emergency rooms treat about 8700 people for injuries, such as falls, cuts and shocks, related to holiday lights, decorations and Christmas trees. Here are a few safety tips compiled from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission taken from a Reader's Digest website. For the full list, see: http://www.rd.com/home-garden/christmas-safety-checklist/article15322.html).

Safer Trees and Decorations

- When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label "Fire Resistant."
- When purchasing a live tree, check for freshness. A fresh tree is green, needles are hard to pull from branches and when bent between your fingers, needles do not break. The trunk butt of a fresh tree is sticky with resin, and when tapped on the ground, the tree should not lose many needles.
- When setting up a tree at home, place it away from fireplaces and radiators. Because heated rooms dry live trees out rapidly, be sure to keep the stand filled with water. Place the tree out of the way of traffic.
- Cut a few inches off the trunk of your tree to expose the fresh wood to allow for better water absorption.
- Use only noncombustible or flame-resistant materials to trim a tree. Choose tinsel or artificial icicles of plastic or nonleaded metals. Leaded materials are hazardous if ingested by children.
- Never use lighted candles on a tree or near other evergreens. Always use nonflammable holders and place candles out of children's reach.
- Take special care to avoid decorations that are sharp or breakable, keep trimmings with small removable parts out of the reach of children to avoid the child swallowing or inhaling small pieces, and avoid trimmings that resemble candy or food, which may tempt a child to eat them.

Bright Ideas for Lights

- Indoors or outside, always use lights that have been tested for safety by a recognized testing laboratory that indicates conformance with safety standards.
- Check each set of lights, new or old, for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires, or loose connections, and throw out damaged sets.
- Use no more than three standard-size sets of lights per single extension cord.
- Never use electric lights on a metallic tree. The tree can become charged with electricity from faulty lights, and a person touching a branch could be electrocuted.
- Before using lights outdoors, check labels to be sure they have been certified for outdoor use.
- Fasten outdoor lights securely to trees, house walls, or other firm supports to protect the lights from wind damage. Use insulated staples to hold strings in place, not nails or tacks.
- Plug all outdoor electric decorations into circuits with ground fault circuit interrupters to avoid potential shocks.
- Turn off all lights when you go to bed or leave the house. The lights could short out and start a fire.

Friendlier Fireplaces

- Use care with "fire salts," which produce colored flames when thrown on wood fires. They contain heavy metals that can cause intense gastrointestinal irritation and vomiting if eaten. Keep them away from children.
- Do not burn wrapping papers in the fireplace. A flash fire may result, as wrappings ignite suddenly and burn intensely.

RECYCLING - REDUCE REUSE RECYCLE RESTORE

The City of Fairfax is proud to unveil an updated list of what we can put in the blue bins and what should stay out. Look for a yahoo group announcement and website link on November 15, National Recycling Day!

Many residents have kindly emailed or called me with their recycling questions. I encourage anyone with questions to feel free to contact either the City at 703.385.7995 or me via phone or email.

The County offers Electric Sundays during which televisions, computers, fluorescent lights and other obsolete electronic equipment can be recycled. The last date for 2010 is Nov 21 at the I-66 Transfer Station (4618 West Ox Rd) between 10AM and 3PM.

During the holidays, we often generate more trash than at other times during the year. Please remember to recycle the wrapping paper or reuse bags and boxes. Of course, the more creative you can be with your wrapping the less likely you are to need to recycle!

Christmas trees will be collected curbside throughout January. There is no need to call ahead for a special pick up.

As we start a new year, please remember to make recycling a resolution that keeps on growing.

ADOPT-A-FIRE-HYDRANT - LAURA DOWNEY

Last year's record snowfalls reminded us all that fire hydrants can get buried underneath the winter snows. As a pre-emptive safety measure, we'd like to ask for volunteers to adopt a fire hydrant in the neighborhood to make sure that in the event that a fire hydrant is needed to protect a neighbor's home, the fire hydrant will be free and clear of snow so that the fire department can make immediate use of a hydrant when needed.


