

COUNTRY CLUB HILLS CIVIC ASSOCIATION

The purpose of the Country Club Hills Civic Association is to encourage civic improvement, to promote the general welfare of the community, to represent the community's viewpoints to the City government, to further the appearance and safety of the neighborhood, and to develop community social activities.

Members of the Board of Directors are limited to two one-year terms in any given office. Their reward comes from you, the members who support, participate in and enjoy the activities and events that CCHCA sponsors.

We feel that it is important to have a healthy civic association that is ready and able to notify you of happenings in the city that enhance or threaten our common interests. This association will represent the neighborhood's interests any time an issue gains the popular support of our members.

The civic association maintains a close interface with city departments thanks to our Civic Affairs Director, and representatives to the Council of Civic Associations and the Chief of Police/Citizens' Advisory Council.

COUNTRY CLUB HILLS CIVIC ASSOCIATION OF FAIRFAX, INCORPORATED BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of the Corporation shall be the Country Club Hills Civic Association of Fairfax, Incorporated, hereinafter called the Corporation.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSES

The purpose of the Corporation shall be:

- A. To promote the general welfare of the Country Club Hills area of Fairfax City, Virginia.
- B. To do all things appropriate and necessary to the foregoing purpose or to conduct the affairs of said Corporation, and to have and to execute all powers granted similar Corporations under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP AREA

The membership area is defined as the Country Club Hills Subdivision of the City of Fairfax, Virginia.

ARTICLE IV.

MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Each family occupying a home in the Country Club Hills subdivision shall be eligible for a membership in the Corporation.
- Section 2. Payment of annual household dues will entitle members to participate fully in the affairs of the Corporation.
- Section 3. The voting power of all memberships shall be equal. No proxy votes will be permitted. Absentee votes will be permitted.

ARTICLE V

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. The Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of the elected officers of the association.
- Section 2. The elected officers of the Corporation shall be a President, six vice presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.
 - Section 3. The President of the Corporation shall serve as Chairman of the Board of Directors.
- Section 4. No elected officer of the Corporation may serve more than two consecutive full terms in the same office in the Corporation.
- Section 5. If a director fails to attend three consecutive regular meetings of the Board of Directors or fails, as determined by the Board of Directors, to perform any of his other duties as a director, his office may be declared vacant by the Board of Directors after consultation with said director and the vacancy filled as herein provided.

Section 6. Vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board of Directors upon approval of twothirds of the members of the Board of Directors present at a duly called meeting of the Board. Such appointee shall serve until the next annual meeting of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at least once per quarter on a date designated by the Board. Special meetings may be called by the President or upon the request of any three directors. A majority of the directors shall constitute a quorum.
- Section 2. A special meeting of the Board of Directors shall also be called upon the written request of any fifteen members of the Corporation. At such meeting, duly designated representatives of said members may attend to present any problem and proposed solutions for consideration by the Board.

ARTICLE VII

ELECTIONS

Section 1. The elected officers of the Corporation shall be the President, six Vice Presidents, the Secretary and the Treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the members and shall themselves be members in good standing of the Corporation. The newly elected officers shall assume their duties immediately after election and shall hold office until the next Annual Meeting of the Corporation.

Section 2. Election Procedures

Prior to the month of January of each year, the President of the Corporation shall appoint a Nominating Committee consisting of a Chairman and four members of the Corporation. The Nominating Committee shall nominate at least one candidate for each office in the Corporation to be filled for the ensuing year. and shall report theses nominations to the Board of Directors prior to the month of January. The Board of Directors shall have the power to add more nominees to the list of the Nominating Committee. The Board shall give written notice to all members of the Corporation of the proposed state of new officers a least seven days prior to the Annual Meeting, which will be held in January.

At the January Annual Meeting, nominations for elected offices may also be made from the floor, provided, that the nominee's consent has been proviously obtained.

At the Annual Meeting, nominations for elected offices shall be made from the floor, provided that the nominee's consent has been previously obtained.

If, after all nominations have been recorded, there is only one nominee for elected office in the Corporation, the President shall instruct the Secretary to record a unanimous vote for the nominee.

If, after all nominations have been recorded, there is more than one nominee for an elected office in the Corporation, a secret written ballot shall be east by the members of the Corporation present. After all election ballots have been east, the President shall appoint at least two members of the Corporation to count the written ballots and announce the election results to the members of the Corporation.

Section 3. Vacancies occurring during the year in any office shall be filled in accordance with Article V, Section 6 of these by-laws.

ARTICLE VIII

DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION

Section 1. The President of the Corporation shall be the Chief Executive Officer for the Corporation and shall exercise general supervision over all operations of the Corporation subject to the provisions of the by-laws of the Corporation. The President shall call and preside over all general membership and Board of Directors meetings of the Corporation; shall appoint a Chairman for each committee of the Corporation, except as otherwise provided for in these by-laws, shall serve as ex-officio member of all committees; and speak for the Corporation before City Council and appropriate Boards and Commissions of the City of Fairfax, Virginia when so directed by the membership or the Board of Directors.

- Section 2. The Vice President for Civic Affairs shall serve as first Vice President of the Corporation and shall act for the President in his absence. He shall attend meetings of the City Council and other City agencies and advise the Board of Directors and the membership of developments or actions within the City of FAIRFAX which affect the members of the Corporation.
- Section 3. The Vice President for Neighborhood Crime Watch shall organize and manage the Country Club Hills Neighborhood Crime Watch Program.
- Section 4. The Vice President of Membership shall coordinate the annual membership drive in September of each year and shall maintain appropriate membership records.
- Section 5. The Vice President for Block Captains shall manage an organization of Block Captains in sufficient depth to: ensure prompt delivery of Corporation newsletters, the Directory, and any special notices; assist the Vice President for Membership in the annual September membership drive and collection of annual dues; assist the Vice President for Publications in the collection of data for the Directory; notify the Chairman of the Welcoming committee of new arrivals to Country Club Hills.
- Section 6. The Vice President for Publications shall produce an annual Directory of the membership area for publication in January; shall produce the Corporation newsletter at least quarterly; and shall develop an advertising plan to help defray cost of the Directory and newsletters, as needed.
- Section 7. The Vice President for Social Activities shall coordinate an annual social program for the members and assist in organizing social activities or clubs as desired by members of the Corporation.
- Section 8. Each Vice President shall maintain an unofficial record (e.g., loose-leaf/"turn-over file") which identifies any property, decorations, funds, checks or other assets for which he is responsible; programs and activities conducted; and problems encountered and solutions taken or recommended in connection with this office.
- Section 9. The secretary of the Corporation shall record all proceedings at official meetings of the Corporation and Board of Directors, shall retain the official files of the Corporation, and shall provide notice to members and officers of all meetings of the Corporation as provided for in the by-laws.
- Section 10. The Treasurer shall act as Chief Financial Officer of the Corporation and shall be responsible for the receipt, custody and disbursement of the Corporation's funds. The Treasurer shall report the balance in the Corporation's checking account and the total obligations at each general membership meeting of the Corporation. At the Annual Meeting in January, the Treasurer shall submit to the members of the Corporation an annual statement of income and expenses for the previous year. The Treasurer shall prepare such tax reports as local, state or federal agencies may require, and shall prepare a draft budget to be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.

ARTICLE IX

COMMITTEES

- Section 1. There shall be the following standing committees of the Corporation: Block Captains; Social: Neighborhood Crime Watch; and Welcoming.
- Section 2. Block Captains Committee. The Vice President for Block Captains shall organize and chair a committee of Area Coordinators and Block Captains as necessary to accomplish the responsibilities outlined in Article VIII, Section 4 of these by-laws.
- Section 3. Social Committee. The Vice President for Social Activities will organize and chair a Social Committee as necessary to accomplish the responsibilities outlined in Article VIII, Section 7 of these By-laws.
- Section 4. Welcoming Committee. The President shall appoint a Chairman of the Welcoming Committee. The Chairman shall be responsible for organizing a committee to call upon, warmly welcome, and provide appropriate information to new arrival to Country Club Hills, to encourage new arrivals to join the Corporation; and to notify the Vice Presidents for Membership, for Block Captains and for Publications of new arrivals.
- Section 5. Neighborhood Crime Watch Committee. The Vice President for the Neighborhood Crime Watch shall be responsible for organizing a Neighborhood Crime Watch Committee and for working closely with the Fairfax City Police Department to organize and maintain a Block Watch Program for Country Club Hills. The Chairman shall report to the Board of Directors and a general membership meetings on the progress and problems in Crime Prevention in Country Club Hills.

Section 6. All committees shall be under the Supervision of the President and subject to the authority delegated by the Board of Directors.

Section 7. At any general membership meeting or meeting of the Board of Directors, special committees may be established and a Chairman appointed by the President.

ARTICLE X

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

- Section 1. General membership meetings shall be held at the call of the President, upon request of a majority of the Board of Directors, or at the written request of fifteen members of the Corporation.
- Section 2. A general meeting, known as the Annual Meeting of the Corporation shall be held during <u>April/May of the month of January</u> each year.
- Section 3. One Two-additional general membership meetings shall be held annually, one in April/May, and one in September/October.
- Section 4. Written notice specifying the date, time, and place of each general membership meeting shall be provided each household at least seven days prior to the scheduled date of the meeting by the Secretary of the Corporation.
 - Section 5. The Order of Business at the General Membership Meetings of the Corporation shall be as follows:
 - (1) Call to Order
 - (2) Reading of the minutes of previous general membership meetings by the Secretary
 - (3) Report of the Treasurer
 - (4) Reports of the Vice Presidents
 - (5) Reports of the Sanding Committees
 - (6) Reports of the Special Committees
 - (7) Transaction and unfinished business
 - (8) Transaction of new business
 - (9) Adjournment
- Section 6. Robert's Rules of Order shall be recognized as governing the rules of procedure at all membership meetings of the Corporation.
- Section 7. Ten percent of the members of the Corporation in good standing shall constitute a quorum at general membership meetings of the Corporation.
- Section 8. If a quorum is not present at any time during a general membership meeting, the meeting may proceed, but no official action of the Corporation may be taken.

ARTICLE XI

DUES AND ASSESSMENTS

- Section 1. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin January 1st of each year.
- Section 2. Household dues shall be no more than \$10.00\$5.00 per fiscal year payable no later than the 31 March of that Annual Meeting in January for the ensuing year.
- Section 3. Assessment shall be authorized by written approval of two thirds majority of the members of the Gorporation and shall be limited to \$5.00 per membership per year.

ARTICLE XII

PROPERTY AND FINANCES

Section 1. The Board of Directors is authorized to encumber the assets of the Corporation.

- Section 2. All disbursements of funds of the Corporation shall be made by check signed by the Treasurer, except the Treasurer may maintain a petty cash fund no to exceed \$50.00. The Treasurer shall disburse Corporation funds in excess of \$50.0 only with the consent of the Board of Directors or the majority of the members present at a membership meeting. Checks over \$199.00 shall be signed by the President as well as the Treasurer.
- Section 3. Personal property of the Corporation, tangible and intangible, may be sold or transferred only for the benefit of the Corporation, and only after the Board of Directors shall have approved the transaction.
- Section 4. The Funds of the Corporation shall be deposited only in financial institutions the deposits of which are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.
- Section 5. The accounts of the Corporation shall be audited annually by a method specified by the Board of Directors.
- Section 6. An annual budget will be prepared prior to the begining of each fiscal year. This budget will be approved by the Board of Directors and will include the setting of annual dues to, at a minimum, match expected disbursements with expected income.

ARTICLE XIII

AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

- Section 1. Amendments to these by-laws may be proposed in writing to the Board of Directors by any two members of the Corporation, and after seven days written notice has been given members, may be adopted by a majority vote of the members present at the next general membership meeting of the Corporation.
- Section 2. No amendments to these by-laws may be made which is inconsistent with the purposes of the Corporation.

ARTICLE XIV

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Section 1. All powers, authority, duties and functions of the members and officers of the Corporation shall be exercised in strict conformity with applicable provisions of the law and regulations with the by-laws of the Corporation.
- Section 2. No Officer of the Corporation shall receive compensation or salary for services rendered the Corporation as an officer or director.
- Section 3. Not for Profit. The Corporation is not organized for profit and no part of any net earnings may benefit any member.
- Section 4. Non-political. Neither the Board of Directors nor the general membership shall endorse any candidate for public office in the name of the Corporation.

PARK INFORMATION & REGULATIONS

City parks are open daily from sunrise until one hour after sunset. Outdoor facilities with lights are open until 11:00 pm daily. Indoor facilities are open only at specified hours or by prior arrangement.

The City has primary responsibility for maintenance of its parks and recreational fields. Athletic clubs and organizations which use fields on a recurring basis are expected to assist in maintenance and upkeep.

Non-profit athletic organizations or individuals may be allocated space by the Director of Parks and Recreation. In order to use the facilities, the following criteria must be met:

Applications must be submitted in writing to the Director of Parks and Recreation.

Two-thirds of the participants (group activity) must reside in the City or County.

No restrictions may be based on race, religion, origin, creed, or sex of the participants.

No recurring or league-type activities may be scheduled at Van Dyck park under terms of the will which bequeathed the park to the City.

School Board activities will pre-empt other activities on all school property.

Applicants must not have previously violated City rules governing use of parks and recreation facilities.

All groups using a facility will be responsible for policing the area used.

The possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs in parks or on athletic fields is prohibited. Any form of gambling is also prohibited.

All animals must be on a leash and must be within voice control of owners.

Refreshment stands and concessions may be operated only with proper prior approval of the Director of Parks and Recreation.

Children's and youth activities (defined as 17 years of age or under) must be adequately chaperoned by at least one adult per 25 children or youths.

Users agree to hold harmless and indemnify the City of Fairfax or any of its officials with respect to any claim of loss, injury, or damage.

The preceding is only a partial synopsis of the rules and regulations established for use of City parks, schools, and facilities. Group use or large family gatherings on any City-owned park or school property should be coordinated with the Director of Parks and Recreation, John C. Wood Municipal complex, Old Lee Highway. Call 385-7858 to make arrangements with the coordinator.

PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

SCHOOLS

Enrollment: A child who has reached the fifth birthday on or before September 1st must be enrolled in kindergarten for that school year beginning in the fall unless prior notification is given to the school board. Children who will reach the fifth birthday after October 1st, but on or before January 1st of the following year, may be enrolled in kindergarten; schools provide counseling regarding the advisability of school attendance for children who fall into the latter age bracket.

A child who will be six years old on or before October 1st must attend school during the school year beginning that fall.

A birth certificate, or equivalent evidence of immunization, and a certificate of physical examination is required for elementary school enrollees.

Several drug abuse programs are located in Northern Virginia. The Fairfax-Falls Church Community Service Board/Substance Abuse Service provides assistance to drug abusers and is located in the City at 10331 Democracy Lane, Suite 105. For information call 591-1393.

TAXES

Not a fun subject, but definitely made easier for us by the City's outstanding organization of "who has to pay what and when."

<u>Businesses</u> - Businesses are required to file a report of taxable personal property between January 1st and May 1st. Go to the commissioner of Revenue's office for guidance or call 385-7880.

<u>Personal</u> - Citizens who own motor vehicles, boats, or campers must file a report of taxable personal property with the Commissioner of Revenue by May 1st of each year. If you file after May 1st, a penalty payment of 10% of the tax assessment will be required.

Personal property taxes are payable to the City Treasurer by October 5th. Personal property is assessed every January by the Commissioner of Revenue. For information call the Revenue Office at 385-7881.

Real Fstate - Taxes are payable to the City Treasurer twice a year on June 5th and December 5th. Tax rate is set by the City Council and assessments are based on 100% of the market value.

TRANSPORTATION

The City-University Energysave (CUE) Bus Service is jointly funded by the City of Fairfax and George Mason University. Buses operate Monday through Friday except on holidays, providing transit service between the University's North and Main campuses and around the City. Handicapped and senior citizens (age 60 and over) ride the CUE bus free of charge.

TRASH, REFUSE, RECYCLING, & LEAF COLLECTION

Trash collection is provided for all single-family residences in the City on a once per week basis. The following materials will be collected:

Garbage, kitchen waste, cold ashes, and other refuse accumulated as a result of normal household activities. This waste must be properly packaged in metal or approved plastic containers designed for trash collection and having handles and tight-fitting covers. Cans for normal collection purposes must be a minimum of 10 gallons and a maximum of 31 gallons. No container may exceed a capacity of 60 pounds or have a dimension exceeding 5 feet.

Grass, weeds, brush, or similar items provided they are placed at the curb on a collection day and compactly bundled so that they can be handled by one person.

Employees assigned to the trash service will continue to pick up regular trash containers at the back door; however, all special items must be placed at the curb by the occupant.

In the trash collection process, owners and occupants have several obligations:

To remove any red-tagged items from the curb collection point within 24 hours.

To properly store trash prior to collection. Maintenance in an orderly fashion of all trash until it is picked up, is the responsibility of the occupant.

To make trash containers accessible to our collection employees at not more than 150 feet from the curb or pick-up point, including leaving gates unlocked where applicable.

Once containers are empty, they must be removed from the curb not later than 8:00 pm of the same day.

Where a special pickup has been arranged with the Department of Public Works, such items may not be placed at the curb more than 24 hours prior to the designated pickup date. We hope through this means to eliminate much of the unsightly accumulation which from time to time appears on various streets.

Recycling Recycling is mandatory in the City. Recyclables should be placed in the blue bin provided by the City and set out on the curb before 7:00 am on trash pick-up day. For more information call 560-BINS.

<u>Hazardous Waste</u> Household hazardous waste cannot be collected and will be red-tagged by the collectors. Household hazardous waste can be dropped off at the Fire and Rescue Training Academy, 4600 West Ox Road (9:00 am to 3:00 pm first and third Saturdays). Used motor oil is collected at the following locations:

<u>Leaf Collection</u> Each fall, the City operates four leaf collection vehicles throughout the City four days a week for as long as leaves continue to accumulate. For more information, call Mr. Shelton at 385-7810.

Brush Pickup Residents may contact the Public Services Department at 385-7825 to arrange for special pickups on Mondays. Arrangements must be made by 6:00 am on Mondays.

Open Burning Prohibited! The City's Air Pollution ordinance prohibits all open burning within the City limits. The ordinance does not apply to outdoor charcoal burners provided there is no excessive smoke being produced.

City residents may call 385-7810 regarding any questions about refuse collection.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Any citizen of the United States who will be eighteen by the date of any election is qualified and entitled to register and to vote. To vote in any election, registration must be completed at least 30 days prior to the election. Virginia has a General Election every November.

Registration hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm at the City Hall Annex. From January through the first Thursday in October registration is taken at the Department of Motor Vehicles at 11215 G Lee Highway, Monday and Thursday from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm. Registration is available 7 days a week at the Fairfax City Regional Library, 3915 Chain Bridge Road, during normal library hours. Registration is also available at the Post Office on Chain Bridge Road on Mondays from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

Voter registration is permanent in Virginia if you remain a resident and vote at least once every four years. It is the responsibility of the voter to notify the Registrar of any change of name and/or address.

Anyone who will be away on Election Day may vote by absentee ballot. If you need any assistance with the registration, absentee ballot, or election process, call the General Registrar, Phylis Salak, at 385-7890.
